ANNUAL VILLAGE MEETING

VILLAGE TASKFORCE

The parish is due for an initial planning visit by the Village Taskforce team on 8 May. This is a service operated by East Riding Council which carries out periodic tasks such as minor pothole repairs, street asset painting, sign repair and washing, and the cutting back of overgrown vegetation. The parish council would be pleased to receive suggestions for tasks of that kind that you have noticed need attention. By the time this news reaches you, you will have only a short while to respond in order for your suggestions to be considered on 8 May. Please inform the clerk of any ideas as soon as possible.



PLANNING – CHANGES TO NEIGHBOUR NOTIFICATIONS

You may have seen on p5 of your copy of *Your East Riding* that the ERYC Planning Dept are to cease notifying those in properties neighbouring a site for which a planning application has been submitted. They will still put up the yellow notice near the site but generally people will need to find out for themselves about applications that may affect them. The official and most reliable way to do this is to register on the East Riding Public Access website where you can opt to be notified of applications as they arise in the parish. PARISH CLERK POST – VACANCY

PRECEPT

After seven years with no rise in the precept, this year, the council has precepted for an extra £500. The main reason for this is the anticipation of adopting the two telephone kiosks from BT. Both require considerable initial maintenance work and the Fangfoss one in particular is leaning and will need more substantial work to correct it. Following that will be adaptations to whatever use is decided upon. The council is still up for ideas for future use. Adoption has yet to be ratified by BT, so plans are still on hold.
