The matter was reported to the Police and to Trading Standards for investigation. You do not need to accept anyone attempting to sell on your doorstep – tell them this is a no cold-calling area and ask them to leave the village. If you have any information about the company they purport to work for and/or a description of the person(s) please report them to Trading Standards on 01482 396301 or the Police on 101
