Village Taskforce

Many of your suggested improvements have already been carried out by the Taskforce, for example, painting the street furniture, washing signs, sweeping and clearing paths. Other jobs, such as potholes and verge cutting, have been passed on to the appropriate departments. Some of these have already been done and others are scheduled. The Taskforce has proved a very successful initiative and is a great help in keeping the parish looking cared-for and prolonging the life of its structures.



Cold calling

Most households in the parish should by now have received information about Cold Calling Zones with a form to complete and return to make your view known. Residences outside of the main streets and built-up areas have not been included because they will be too far from the No Cold Calling Zone signs for them to be effective. If you have not received the form, but think you should have, please contact the Parish Clerk (see over).
